
Year 4 Drop off



Reading





Children choose appropriate texts from our Book Band shelves. Parents, carers and teachers listen to children read as often as possible. We would expect children to read at home at least 3 times a week.



Children record their reading in a Reading Log.



Children are encouraged to change their books regularly.



Children will select a book from our class book shelves to read during Reading for Pleasure time.



Reading in School



As well as hearing children read individually, we share longer more in-depth texts together as a whole class. We call this **Book Study**.

Children also apply key 'reading for meaning' skills. We identify and answer 6 types of questions using the **Reading**Vipers!








Writing in Y4



In Year 4, children will continue to develop and apply their skills as they move through the "Writing Sequence".






Grammar Progression Policy




English Grammar Progression Policy

Swimming



- Children in both classes will have the opportunity to go swimming at Graves Leisure Centre.
- All levels of swimming are catered for, from non-swimmers to competitive squad swimmers. Children's confidence, technical ability with different strokes and fitness are assessed by the swimming instructors and then they are grouped according to their needs for their lessons.
- Y4DF will go swimming from September to February.



- Y4S will go swimming from February to July.
- Please note Children cannot swim with earrings in, so if you are planning on getting your children's ears pierced, the start of the summer holidays is a good time.


